Dear Parent/ Carer,

I hope you are all safe and well. Since I last wrote to you, we have returned all of our lessons back to onsite provision here at the Academy and City College. It is fantastic to see the beating heart of this community back in full swing! We have been able to welcome the vast majority of our students back to the classroom and, despite tightened measures in our revised risk assessment, the use of face masks being one of the most difficult to expect from our students, they have done themselves and their teachers proud! It really is a pleasure to see them back where they belong, interacting with their friends, teachers and support staff.

Of course, a thorough and comprehensive programme of Lateral Flow Testing was needed in order to allow this to happen and, as you will know, we conducted more than 3000 tests over the course of 6 days to ensure that no student returning to the Academy carried any risk of infection. My thanks go out to you as parents for trusting our testing programme and to the staff who volunteered to make it happen.

Home testing arrangements (Lateral Flow Device Testing):

Thank you for your positive and supportive responses to home testing. All students should have enough tests to last them until the end of the first week back after Easter. They are now expected to test themselves during the Easter holidays. Upon their return, they will be provided with new kits to take home.

Year 9 Preference Evening:

A huge thank you to all parents of Year 9 students. We have received a massive and swift response to our preference selection process for next year's Key Stage 4. We are now in the middle of building September's timetable to incorporate each child's preferences wherever possible. Your child will be informed of their the result later in the Summer term. Grading – Summer 2021:

We sent out information to all families of Year 11, 12 and 13 pupils explaining our approach to awarding grades this summer. We remain on track with our plans and will communicate with students and their families where appropriate throughout the rest of the academic year.

We are still waiting for confirmation from the DfE about a leaving date for our Year 11 and 13 students. We are provisionally working towards a date around the middle of June, although any planning at this point is subject to change in line with DFE guidance. On 23^{rd} March the nation marked one year since the first UK lockdown.


Since that date, millions of people have been bereaved, both as a result of Covid-19 and due to other causes.

As part of our Reflection, students created their own daffodils during Tutorials, and then took them home to display in a window, as well as taking part in the nationwide "beacon of remembrance" on their doorsteps by beaming phones, candles and torches into the night sky at 8pm.

Another way that we can pay our respects for those people we have lost is by adding their name to our tree of remembrance.

Form teachers have a collection of leaves that you can write the names of any people you want to remember who have lost their lives over the last 12 months. These leaves will then be added to our tree outside CS1, and you can use this as a space for you to pay your respects.










Digital Curriculum at HAYWOOD ACADEMY



We have been delighted to see students return to the academy - there is no replacement for in-person teaching, and we are thrilled to have the students back!

Along with the return to life at school, we are pleased to see that the number of students with devices in school has improved massively. Thank you to parents and carers for supporting this. This enables students to access the very best digital curriculum on offer, including having access to research tasks and interactive tools, as well as **Google Classrooms**, **GCSEPod**, **Educake**, **Mathswatch** and much, much more!

Students who are bringing devices in already have seen an increase in independence, opportunities to extend learning past the classroom and partake in interactive quizzes and activities that would otherwise be impossible without a device. Students are encouraged to get out their device at the start of every lesson, alongside their planners and pencil cases, which is why the laptops and Chromebooks are such an essential piece of learning equipment.

As part of our journey working towards a more digital future at the academy, Chromebooks and laptop devices are going to be an essential piece of equipment for all students at the academy, Year 7 through to Year 13.

Therefore, after Easter, we will be conducting an audit of all students to find out which device they have available to them. This information will then be used to open up another period of the Haywood Chromebook Scheme, allowing more parents to purchase devices if they wish. All students should bring in a device (laptop or Chromebook) after Easter if they are able to, and we can then identify the students who don't have access to a device, enabling us to provide relevant support.

Remember, if you wish to bring a personal device in, we are happy to provide the safeguarding software free of charge, which is installed in school by our IT support team. Should you choose to bring your own device in, please ensure it is adequately insured as we cannot accept any responsibility for loss or damage to personal devices.


THE BOOKS THAT MADE HAYWOOD

Year 9 Preference Process!

On Thursday 18th March we held our virtual Year 9 Preference Evening and Parents' Evening. 93% of parents and students engaged in the evening, making this our most successful preference evening ever! We introduced our new electronic recording of choices and students and parents had access to all of the curriculum and subject information via short video presentations and our new updated Curriculum pages on the website.

Please feel free to take a look in the Curriculum section of the Academy website, at our subject specific information about the courses on offer, for all year groups, and short videos, showcasing the work that takes place.

Our Year 9 students have already received the following support when selecting their preference choices:

Throughout January and February during lesson time, subject teachers provided information to students about the courses on offer.

On **Thursday 11th March 2021**, Year 9 received their preference assembly where the preference process was explained, and they were introduced to the subject selection on offer. Students then had the opportunity to discuss with their form tutors any individual questions. At this point, the Microsoft Preference form went live for completion.

On **Thursday 18th March 2021** we held our Subject Parents' Evening and Preference Evening where students and parents were able to book virtual appointments with subject staff through the Virtual Parents' Evening Booking System, where they could discuss in detail subject specifications and suitability.

Careers advisors were on hand as well as our Year 9 Performance Leader, to ensure all students had full access to any information and guidance required.

Thursday 25th March 2021 saw our final deadline for Year 9 preference selections to be made. Students were asked to complete their Microsoft form with their final preference choices and we are pleased to report we have had over 95% success in placing our students with all 4 of their first preference choices.

We are now in the process of building the timetable for 2021-2022 and students will be informed of their timetable for Year 10 in July.

What are you up to THIS SUMMER?

On Friday 26th March the local NCS (National Citizen Service) team spoke to our Year 11s all about the NCS Summer Programme and how they can get involved in a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity where they will:

- Meet new people

MYEd App



We are changing the way that we communicate with parents, and relaunching the My Ed app.

We would like all parents to download this so that they can keep up to date with what is going on in school. The app is free to download, notifications are free to receive, and parents can send messages to the school free of charge.

What sort of information can parents see?

The app needs to be downloaded on the phone that has the same number that we have on record.

If we do not have the mobile number stored you can download the app but

it will not show your child's details.

It is very important that we are kept up-to-date with any change of mobile number so that you can continue to use the app.

You can only see information about your own children, and so there is no risk of anyone being able to see information about other students. The app includes information about:

- Attendance (absence can also be reported through the app)
- Forms to complete can be downloaded (change of address etc.)
- · Key dates- important things going on in school
- Contact numbers
- News items
- Links to social media

How to download the app:

- 1. Go to your app store
- 2. Search for My Ed
- 3. Download the app
- 4. Search for the school name

As long as the mobile number is the same as the one on SIMS then the app will automatically bring up details for students linked to that number. If there is more than one child in the family then it will bring up details for all students.

Students can download the app too but they will not be able to see information about them. They will be able to see general information about the school such as news, key dates etc.

ParentPay

Coming soon: Online payments to school with ParentPay!

Starting within the next few weeks we will be introducing a more convenient way to pay for school meals, and other school items online, using a secure service called ParentPay.

You will have a secure online account, activated using a unique username and password; you will be prompted to change these, and to keep them safe and secure.

Parents will receive an activation email from platform@parentpay.com.

ParentPay offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week - safe in the knowledge that the technology used is of the highest internet security available.

Haywood Academy would like to have your feedback. You can do this by using Parent View. If you would like to comment please follow the instructions below:

CONNECT TO THE INTERNET:

Put the following link into a browser:

https://parentview.ofsted.gov.uk/ login?destination=/give-your-views

(this will take you to the website page where you can set up an account).

You need your email address and password for the simple log-in process.

Just follow the on-screen instructions and you will be sent an email to activate your account. Once you have created an account and activated it, you will be able to complete the online questionnaire quite quickly and easily.

TO SEARCH FOR A SCHOOL:

Enter the name of the school and part of the address (road, city, town or postcode) in the search boxes when you are asked to. Select your child's school from the search results

THE QUESTIONNAIRE:

There will be 12 statements to consider- for example, "My child is happy at this school"each with a choice of responses for you to select from:

Strongly agree • Agree • Disagree

Strongly disagree
Don't know

Use the "Next" button to move to the next question or the "Previous" button to go back. Once you have completed all 12 questions, click on "Finish the survey" and the questionnaire is complete.
