

Amazing Artists!



Students have been working on a weekly basis this term across the Art department with different artists on locally inspired projects.

Groups across Years 7, 8 and 9 have been working with artist **Richard Franks** on a project called 'Re-imagining Burslem' in which they are drawing, deconstructing and reimagining the buildings in Burslem. Through this project they will be making ceramic and cardboard 3D and relief structures.

Next term, students will have the opportunity to visit the Black Country Museum to explore different approaches to industrial heritage.

Students have also had the opportunity this term to develop their approaches to illustration with **Rumbidzai Savanhu**.

Over 3 weeks they have drawn images of people and objects that have meaning to them, developing their work through the processes Rumbi herself uses.

Every week they have used illustration to explore different inspiration and drawing techniques, and have learnt that anyone can draw!

Both of these projects are delivered by **PICL** (Partners in Creative Learning) and Funded by the **Arts Council**, and students' work will be showcased in an exhibition later in the year!







Impressive Impresarios!

As part of the **Character & Arts Foundation**, our students had the opportunity at the end of February to take part in a Hallé Impresarios programme, led by the team at **Hallé Connect**.

Throughout the programme, they had the opportunity to engage in the process of planning and organising a musical concert, and at the end of the day, they presented their final idea. We are extremely proud of everyone who participated!

A special mention must go to our runners up team 'Youth Choir', and our overall winners, team 'Harpful Harmonies'!





Innovative young people!

Through the **Character & Arts Foundation**, Haywood and City College students - alongside students from Trentham Academy - had the opportunity to represent the academy at the Youth Innovation Conference in Manchester back at the end of January.

Our young people were invited as guest speakers to lead a workshop around a topic of their choice.

They shared their views on some of the struggles that young people face, and led a workshop to industry professionals to get them thinking about how they could support young people.

The workshop was a huge success, and all of our young people did an incredible job!

Kate then ran practical workshops sharing her mono-printing technique with the students.






Facing the future

Amazing Apprenticeships







Monday 5th – Sunday 11th February was National Apprenticeship Week, and so we dedicated our PSHE Day on 7th February to apprenticeships and careers!

Students engaged in a range of activities across the day, learning about critical skills that employers are looking for, attributes for a successful career, and jobs of the future.

Years 9 and 10 heard from **Ornua Foods** and the **Royal Navy** about their apprenticeship programmes, and all students across the academy met training providers and employers at our first Careers Fair!



Students have been introduced to 10 key career skills that they will be using throughout their lessons, and which staff will signpost to students when they are being used with these icons on the board:



Students will also have a booklet that they will fill in during Community Time to evidence their use of these career skills, and which can then be used when it comes to writing CVs and making applications to college, university, or employment.

On Thursday 22nd February, 19 Year 7 & 8 students visited **Wedgwood** as part of an ongoing project with the **British Ceramics Biennial**.

The students were able to look around the museum and galleries to see the fantastic ceramics collection on display.

Students created studies from the pottery they saw, and this provided inspiration for their own plates which they decorated later in the day.

Students also had the opportunity to go on a factory tour to see the process of creating ceramic pieces from start to finish.

Seeing techniques such as the use of sprig moulds allowed students to use this technique when decorating their own plates in the craft studio.

A massive thank you to the British Ceramics Biennial for organising these ongoing activities and opportunities for our students, including trips like this and our weekly ceramics club.

Various poets of the GCSE Power and Conflict anthology were in attendance, and they both performed their poems and offered the students insight behind the meaning and significance of lines within their work.

All the students behaved impeccably throughout the event and represented the school brilliantly. They particularly enjoyed performances from Imtiaz Dharker, John Agard, and current Poet Laureate Simon Armitage, saying they had relished the experience and that it had benefitted their studies.

Animal **Attractions**

On 7th February we welcomed Year 5 pupils from Norton-le-Moors and New Ford primaries for an interactive session with Wings & Things, where they got to meet a whole host of birds and other animals, including Bob the boa!





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Year 7 have been learning about 'Stewardship' in their RE lessons this term. 'Stewardship' is our responsibility to look after the planet, and to put this into practice, students planted grass heads as part of their learning.
