On 26th June, over 100 Year 10 students from Haywood Academy stepped out of the classroom and into the professional world for an enriching Work Shadowing Day.

The initiative gave students the opportunity to gain first-hand insight into various career paths, with many attending placements in person while others participated in virtual experiences within the school.

Those who completed the virtual program earned certificates to enhance their CVs and college applications.



#### **Glowing Employer Feedback**

Employers were full of praise for our students, commending their politeness, maturity, adaptability, and professionalism. One student impressed with their confidence in answering questions and eagerness to step outside their comfort zone. Another demonstrated genuine kindness and patience while supporting younger children, showing strong potential for a future in specialist education settings.

Students tackled real-life tasks, from assisting with meetings and branding projects, to customer service and stock management. Employers described them as polite, reliable, and engaged, with several showing a natural flair for communication and teamwork.

**Faye** visited **Knights Solicitors**, where she toured the office, joined branding meetings, and contributed to admin tasks. The welcoming environment helped her feel at ease, and she appreciated the insights into PR and communications.

**Paige** spent her day at **Keele University**, where she was warmly hosted by staff and immersed in the world of social work. From campus tours to student meetings and admin duties, Paige described the day as "amazing," noting how much she learned about potential career paths and university life.

**Rosa-May** supported operations at **Music Mania** alongside her dad. She took pride in organizing stock, serving customers, and contributing to daily tasks. "It helped me with my anxiety and confidence," she shared. "I wasn't just doing what I was told—I was taking over tasks to be more independent."

## Cadbury World

Year 10 Business Students Experience the Sweet Side of Learning!



On Friday 4th July 2025, 45 Year 10 Business Studies students embarked on an exciting educational visit to **Cadbury World** in Birmingham. The trip offered a fantastic opportunity for students to see their classroom learning come to life in a real-world business environment.

The day was carefully aligned with several key topics from the Business Studies curriculum, including **risks and rewards**, **product range**, **marketing**, **competition**, **adding value**, and **branding**. Seeing these concepts in action at one of the UK's most iconic brands gave students valuable insight into how successful businesses operate and stay ahead in competitive markets.

During their visit, students took part in a **one-hour GCSE Business workshop**, where they explored Cadbury's strategic business decisions and learned more about the company's journey from a small family business to a global brand. They also enjoyed an immersive **4D cinema experience**, indulged in **chocolate tasting**, and even tried their hands at chocolate-tempering during a **chocolatier experience**. A **self-guided tour of the factory** provided a behind-the-scenes look at the chocolate-making process and Cadbury's history.

The students were a credit to the school, demonstrating enthusiasm, curiosity, and excellent behaviour throughout the day.

It was a thoroughly enjoyable and enriching experience - both educational and delicious - and we are proud of how fabulously our students represented the school.



### Haywood Academy Celebrates VE Day

### Art Trip to the Black Country Living Museum



Back in May the Art Department visited the **Black Country Living Museum** and **Dudley Tunnel**. This was part of an ongoing project supported and funded by **@piclstokecep**.

During the day students experienced different historical crafts, shops and industrial heritage. They learnt what it was like to live during different periods of time and experienced going down a drift mine in the dark.

Students discovered that there were a lot of connections and similarities between Stoke and the Black Countries. They explored bike, sweet and record shops as well as different toilets through time.

They also went on a canal trip through the **Dudley Tunnel** where students were treated to an underground light show in massive caverns. Everyone learnt something about their heritage, had new experiences and saw different things they can incorporate in to their artwork

### Greenpower at Blyton Park

After a very early start, our Greenpower team attended **Blyton Park** race track on the 8th July, racing the electric powered car they have been testing and modifying during the Greenpower after school club: No. 132, the **Haywood Flyer**.

They competed in two races against over 30 teams from schools all across the UK

They managed to achieve a perfectly respectable 5th place in the first race of the day, and managed to gain 4th place in the second race, only narrowly missing out on the chance of a trophy.

It was an excellent achievement for the team, showing great teamwork and putting in a brilliant amount of effort.

## Future-Ready

Haywood's Careers Day Sets Students on Course




Haywood Academy proudly hosted its third Careers Day of the year—a dynamic, school-wide event that connected students to real-world career experiences and professional insights. From Year 7 through to Year 10, students took part in tailored programmes that showcased diverse industries and practical learning opportunities, fostering curiosity, independence, and a clearer vision of life beyond education.

#### Year 10: Into the Working World

On 26th June, **Year 10** students stepped out of the classroom to embark on their Work Shadowing Day. Those who participated spent the day gaining firsthand experience by shadowing professionals in their chosen fields. Following the event, students reflected on their experiences during Form Time sessions and considered future career pathways.

Students who didn't engage in external placements completed a Virtual Work Experience programme through **Springpod**. This structured alternative allowed them to explore different industries online and earn certificates upon completion, which served as valuable additions to their college applications and CVs.



#### **Year 8: Exploring STEAM Careers**

Year 8 students immersed themselves in the world of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths) through a lively programme of expert talks and interactive sessions.

Guest speakers from local universities and creative industries helped bring each subject to life. Students rotated through breakout sessions in designated groups, gaining deeper insight into how STEAM fields shape the modern world.

#### **Year 9: Green Careers in Action**

**Year 9** was introduced to sustainability-focused careers through a hands-on **Green Careers Day**. The morning began with themed lessons about environmental responsibility, followed by a student-led project in the afternoon.

From planting and recycling to upcycling and energy audits, students explored how eco-conscious careers make a positive impact. They concluded the day with reflection activities designed to encourage long-term interest in green industries.



#### Year 7: Stoke Centenary Media Challenge

Year 7 students took part in a creative **Media Challenge** celebrating Stoke's centenary. The day began with an introduction to media roles and skills, followed by group tasks in prop-making and on-camera interviews. Students worked together to produce news segments using digital editing tools like **Canva**, and the final presentations were showcased in a celebratory event where standout entries were recognised.

#### **A Day That Shaped Aspirations**

Careers Day at Haywood Academy reflected the school's dedication to preparing students for success beyond the classroom. Through thoughtful planning and community support, each year group experienced meaningful opportunities to explore the world of work, creativity, and innovation.

Over the last 5 months, the **Year 7 Cascade group** have been meeting weekly after school to work towards creating something special for the huge celebratory event, the People's Parade, which took place on a soggy Saturday in June.

In the lead up to the event, the group developed a theme for their section of the parade (wildlife, environment & nature), they created a new creature for Stoke-On-Trent (a **Foxoloti**), they had loads of brilliant ideas and they commissioned artists to bring these ideas to life.

Some of the students even came in during the holidays to look through CVs and score applications of the artists who had applied for their commission. The artists they chose to work with were Holly Johnson, Eve Dearbhail Travis, Louise Worrall, Jess Rost and Kate Powell.

The group spent time collaborating with the artists and would give direction when they thought things needed to change, which was a fun and exciting process for both the artists and students.

Holly ran workshops for the whole of Year 7 to create Guardians of the Greenspaces costumes and flags for the parade.
Louise went into Mill Hill Primary Academy and Smallthorne
Primary Academy to run costume making workshops with Year
5s. Eve created the Symbiotic Scavenger costumes for the steering group. Jess & Kate created the big Foxolotl (half Fox, half Axolotl), which was a big puppet on wheels that ate trash and was bursting out of the Stoke Incinerator.

The students were even lucky enough to visit the artists at their studios and see how the creations were coming along. They visited Jess & Kate at the artist co-operative at **Ashbank Farm** where they live and work. Here they met other artists working onsite, saw new work being created and they added their vines and posters to the Foxolotl. In the afternoon they visited Eve & Holly at **The Block** in Newcastle-Under-Lyme to try on their costumes.

On Saturday 7 June the group saw all their ideas all come together in the **People's Parade**. They were joined by other year 7s from Haywood Academy, 2 students from Smallthorne Primary Academy and 2 students from Mill Hill Primary Academy.

They walked in the parade alongside 1000 other participants and were watched by thousands more in the audience. They were all full of energy feeding trash to the Foxolotl and did not let the rain dampen their spirits! We are so proud of what they achieved and their commitment!

Since the parade, some members of the Cascade group have delivered a presentation and a creative workshop to Year 6 students at **Smallthorne Primary Academy** which was to share the work they'd been doing this year and to encourage those who might be attending Haywood next year to join the cascade group. They were confident, clear and delivered a session that the Year 6s loved!

More of the steering group will be running the same session with Year 6 at **Mill Hill Primary Academy** in July.

#### Foxylotl on Parade

Through weeks of workshops, they designed and made vibrant costumes and an eye-catching float featuring the Foxylotl – a recycling-loving creature that was "fed" by the crowd as it travelled through the city.

It was a brilliant way to celebrate Stoke-on-Trent's centenary through creativity, community, and collaboration.



#### Hallé Concert and Adopt-a-Player Project

Over 200 of our children visited Victoria Hall this term to watch the Hallé Orchestra perform live.

The concert included an interactive section where children sang along with the orchestra, giving them a wonderful opportunity to be part of the music.

As part of the **Adopt-a-Player** project, children from Haywood, Mill Hill, and Smallthorne worked with a Hallé musician to create their own interpretation of Holst's *The Planets*. The project culminated in a joint performance at Haywood, where the children came together to share their work and perform with the musician they had been collaborating with.
